Classes

Girls attend two classes a day for the summer. They participate in a morning class, break for lunch and participate in an afternoon class. During welcome and special weeks all girls will participate in the same activities. If a girl participates in both summer sessions they will benefit from all of the following:

Session 1 & 2

1st Grade: Get Lit with STEM: In this academic enrichment class, girls will build their individual literacy while exploring STEM. This class will offer fun and engaging activities that will help girls build their vocabulary and find their inner scientist.

lst Grade: Colorful Creations: In this class, girls will use creative projects to promote their ability to take care of their mental health. Girls will have the opportunity to use different mediums of art to express themselves and to create meaningful and personal masterpieces.

Session 1 2nd-5th Grade

Imagine Science: Imagine Science is a STEM curriculum that uses technology and hands-on exploration to discover the connections between air, water & food and how we're affected by them.

Su Teatro: Through games, skit creation, and writing exercises girls will learn the art of creating, performing and critically responding. Girls will also explore other aspects of teatro: acting, music, technical elements, playwriting, directing, movement, etc.

Session 2

2nd-5th Grade

Youth Biz: Have you ever wanted to sell a product? Learn how! Design products, create marketplaces and learn about entrepreneurship in this fun and hands-on, business class.

B.A.L.L. (Beyond Athletics, Life Lessons):

Girls will learn about the importance of staying active by exploring the basics of soccer, baseball, basketball, golf, and tennis. In addition to staying active, girls will be encouraged to connect athletic lessons to life lessons using spoken word.
