

Denver Health Pediatrics at Denver Public Schools School-based Health



Our School-based Health Centers (SBHC) offer no-cost pediatric care. Services are available to any Denver Public Schools (DPS) student or child that attends a DPS affiliated Early Childhood Education (ECE) center within Denver County. These clinics offer convenient care that limits the amount of time students are out of class and parent/guardians have to be off work. Students are able to get same day or next day appointments.

SERVICES

- · Well Child Checks or sports physicals. This may include routine lab tests and immunizations
- · Prescriptions and medications
- · Care for chronic conditions such · Parent and child health as asthma and depression
- Care for acute injury and illness
- · Individual, group and family mental health counseling
- · Dental screening, sealants, routine cleanings, and dental X-rays (at select locations)

Telehealth appointments are available.

PARENTAL CONSENT

A parent or guardian must sign a consent form before their child may use Denver Health Pediatric services. Once this is done, the child can use clinics at any time during the current school year. Supporting family communication is a core value of the health center. Clinic staff encourages patients to discuss health care with their parents.

To sign the consent form, use the website / QR code below. You can also sign a paper copy in our clinics.

In accordance with Colorado State Law, SBHCs allow DPS students (if requested) to consent themselves into certain confidential services.

This includes behavioral and reproductive/sexual health services. Parental or guardian consent is required for all other services for students under 18. Questions from parents/guardians can be directed to SBHCs at sbhc@dhha.org or 303-602-8958.

COST & INSURANCE

There is no charge to the patient or their family for services offered in the clinic. Patients will not have to pay co-pays, deductibles, or fees to be seen. Insurance may be billed but without cost to the family. Community Health Care Advisors are available to assist students and families with questions, eligibility, and enrollment into the healthcare programs.


