# DRESS CODE Reminders!

#### 2022-2023 Dress Code Policy

To ensure effective and equitable enforcement of this dress code, school staff shall enforce the dress code consistently and in a manner that does not reinforce or increase marginalization or oppression of any group based on race, sex, gender identity, gender expression, sexual orientation, ethnicity, religion, cultural observance, household income or body type/size.

**SHIRT:** Monday-Friday- Any KSPA polo, KSPA social justice T-Shirts, or KSPA sweaters (no hoods). Fridays Only- college T-Shirts/sweatshirts



**BOTTOMS:** Monday-Friday- Light-khaki, tan, brown or black (including black jeans); Skirts, capris or shorts; of an appropriate knee length; students may wear blue jeans on Fridays ONLY



**SHOES:** Tennis shoes or dress shoes No open toe shoes (Boots are permitted but student MUST be able to participate in outdoor PE in them.)

## <u>Independent Reading</u> Data

We wanted to provide an update for Independent Reading to further support students engaging with their JRB (Just Right Book).

As a reminder, research shows that when a student reads a million words in a school year they will grow a grade level.

- **5th Grade-** 4,182,402
- **6th Grade-** 6,732,837
- **7th Grade-** 1,283,957
  - 1 student above 500,000
- **8th Grade-** 8,953,371
  - 1 Student at a million words!

We would love to encourage you to push students to <u>assign</u> themselves by reading their JRB to help keep reading culture alive! <3

## ELA iReady Data

We wanted to provide an update for iReady instruction. As a reminder, iReady is the program that students can work on to improve specific reading strategies.

#### **Data from ELA iReady LAST Week:**

45% of students were on iReady for 30+ minutes in the last week. This is an increase from 32% last week!

Below is % of students for each GL passed:

- **5th Grade-** 13
- **6th Grade-** 27
- **7th Grade-** 53
- 8th Grade- 2

Year to Date (YTD), We have 69 students who have passed 10+ lessons this year. This is up from 52 students last week. Keep it up!
