
Principal's Corner


Uniforms and Technology

April Cafecito Updates

Moving forward, updates to items in the Cafecito agenda will be placed in the newsletter here.

- Suggestion: Cafecito families suggested that we send home corner ticket notes that require a signature for meetings and announcements:

- Suggestion: Cafecito families suggested that we take cell phones and airpods in the morning. Cafecito families would volunteer to help.
 - Update: This is too large of a policy change to implement this year. We will include this suggestion into the planning for next school year. Next year, we want to have a cell phone/airpod collection process during arrival to prevent technology use during the day.
- Cafecito families discussed that some students continue to not wear school uniforms.
 - Mrs. Raybon is requiring all advisors to have meetings this month with families whose children are exhibiting behavior trends related to uniform, technology and disruptive behaviors.
- Bullying Prevention: Families at cafecito shared frustrations with continuing bullying at KSPA.
 - Update: This week, Mrs. Raybon led a bullying assembly with each grade level, and students completed a survey about their
 experiences with bullying at KSPA. The social workers are going to make discussion groups for students who are victims of bullying or
 who are bullying themselves.
- · Suggestion: Cafecito families suggested that we do home visits to ensure families are aware of the school rules.
 - Update: This suggestion is part of our beginning of year plan for next year. All new families will receive a home visit and returning families must attend a mandatory grade level family meeting where they will sign the KSPA Family/Student contract.
