What is Safe2Tell?

Safe2Tell provides students, parents, and community members a safe and anonymous way to report information about any issues that concern their safety or the safety of others. Safe2Tell's reporting process is simple. Call to interact with a live, trained analyst (call takers) or fill out a form via the website or mobile app.



Report Types

97.1% of all Safe2Tell reports during the 2022-2023 school year were valid. This means that the majority of reports were submitted for the right reasons to protect students and keep schools safe.

During the school year, the program received 22,486 reports! This is the highest report volume the program has ever received!

We are so proud of Colorado students for being advocates!

1 in every 9 reports submitted is a duplicate report. This means we are receiving multiple reports about the same concern and that multiple people are speaking up!


Why is this a reason to celebrate? The bystander effect is not happening here! We are proud of our upstanders across the state of Colorado!
